Preliminary agenda

The programme comprises plenary presentations, parallel sessions and poster sessions. Visits to the town of Craiova are offered on the first day of the conference.

The first Romanian-Bulgarian-Serbian-Hungarian conference isn't just about listening to geographers and other researchers from the countries in the Danube's lower basin; it's also about engaging them in new and unique ways. The format, based on an interactive sharing of thoughts between participants and speakers, will serve as a springboard for the development of a sound, cohesive cooperation policy.

Each session consists of two types of specific formats.

- **Presentations:** Each session contains 15 minute presentations for specific topical perspective.
- Roundtable Panels: After the presentations are concluded, the speakers involved in that session will join the members of the Scientific Advisory Committee for a free-flowing, one-hour panel discussion about the challenges and future trends for the sustainable cooperation within the lower basin of the Danube. As part of that roundtable discussion, audience members will be asked to nominate and establish the work group and its Steering Board, that should meet every year to address this issue.

We suggest you post your contact information for those who may wish to contact you to discuss your research outside of your appointment time.

Poster Development Tips

- The presentation should cover the same material as the submitted abstract.
- Place the title of your paper prominently at the top of the poster with authors' names directly beneath, highlight the authors name, e-mail address in case viewers are interesting in contacting you for more information.
- Highlight your title and subheadings with colours or coloured lines.
- Don't crowd too much information on the poster; concentrate on 2 or 3 main points.
- Minimize complete sentences and paragraphs.
- Prepare all diagrams or charts neatly and legibly in a size sufficient to be read at a distance of 2 meters. Use squares, rectangles, circles, etc. to group like ideas. Don't clutter your poster with too much text.
- A serif font (e.g. Times) is often easier for reading main text, and a non-serif font (Arial, Helvetica) is suggested for headers and figure labels.

Oral Presentation

- Prepare a 15 minute presentation to allow time for your introduction and questions from the audience which are very important in your 20 minute time slot.
- Arrive at your session room 20 minutes before the session begins to upload your presentation.
- Use Microsoft PowerPoint for your presentation.
- Projects and Microsoft Windows-based laptops with Microsoft Office 2007 will be provided.

About Craiova

The settlement with the name Craiova was documentary attested in 1475, on the1st of June. In 1968 Craiova is declared municipality. The city has a population of 308.000 inhabitants and a surface of 8.141 hectares.

Historical place of the great boyars Craioveşti and Buzeşti – *chief town of the Little Wallachia* – old settlement, with rich cultural traditions, Craiova is located on the left bank of the Jiu river, in the north-eastern part of Dolj County, at 44°2' N and 23°5' S and it is characterised by altitudes comprised between 75 and 116 meters.

The seat of Dolj County is located almost in the centre of the Oltenian region, on a depression waterpot contoured at the contact between the Getic Piedmont and the Central Oltenian Plain.

Craiova is located at the crossroads of important communication lines that connect Bucharest and Timişoara from east to the west and, respectively, the fluvial port Calafat with the Transylvanian region, from the south to the north. Craiova always represented a passing point towards the Danube region, that of the Iron Gates, the Olt Valley, the Eastern Plain and Transylvania. Taking into account the wider European framework, there is to be mentioned the city's location on the European Priority Transportation Corridor IV, being easily accessible.

During its existence, the city benefited from favourable natural conditions that enabled its continuous development.
